CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE (Billerbeck)

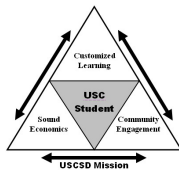
Mrs. Billerbeck called the meeting to order at approximately 7:00 p.m.

Awards & Recognitions

District

- Highest SAT Scores for Region and Ranked #6 in Pennsylvania
- Ranked #1 School in Western Pennsylvania by Pittsburgh Business Times
- USCSD named among the nation's Best Communities for Music Education, by the NAMM Foundation for the 4th consecutive year. USC is one of only 14 school districts in Allegheny County, 92 in Pennsylvania and 624 from across the country to earn the distinction.
- USC High School honored with a Golden Globe Award from the Pennsylvania State Modern Language Association as part of its PSMLA Exemplary Program (PEP) Awards Showcase. USC is one of only three high schools in Allegheny County to earn the Golden Globe. The PEP Awards honor exemplary Pennsylvania high school world language programs.
- USC High School ranked among the top two percent of high schools in the nation, according to the US News and World Report in its list of 2019 Best High Schools. Ranked ninth in Pennsylvania, USC is the highest-ranking high school in Allegheny County. Nationally, USC ranks 444th out of the 23,265 high schools in the nation– among the top two percent.

- According to the 2019 Guide to Western Pennsylvania Schools, published by The Pittsburgh Business Times, Upper St. Clair School District ranks first among 102 school districts throughout the seven-county Pennsylvania region and third among the commonwealth's 500 school districts.

Students

- Ayush Sharma was selected as a 2019 Gold Medalist in the Congressional Awards Program representing Pennsylvania's 14th Congressional District and was recognized at the annual Gold Medal Ceremony in Washington, D.C. during the summer of 2019
- Reese Benonis, Samuel Ding, Serena Luo, and Grace A. Wagner were named Finalists in the 2019 National Merit Scholarship Program
- The Speech & Debate team captured it's second Pennsylvania High School Speech League Championship in three years. The team placed first in the Speech Sweepstakes Championship, second in Debate Sweepstakes and took home its second Cumulative Sweepstakes Award, the first coming in 2013.
- Annabel McQuillan was selected through competitive audition to participate in the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association All State Choir. She placed Second Chair out of 26 students in the Alto 2 Section of Region Choir.
- Phoebe Chen was named the First Place winner of the 2019 Center Ohio Flute Association (COFA) Competition in the Junior Division. She performed Henri Büsser: Prelude Scherzo, Op. 35 and George Philipp Telemann: Fantasia No. 1 in A Major at the competition was held at Ohio State University, School of Music.
- Students raised \$58,476.69 through the Third Annual USC Mini-THON – exceeding their \$50,000 goal. The event benefits Four Diamonds, an organization that assists children who are battling cancer and their families at Penn State Health Children's Hospital in Hershey. Nearly 350 high school students were on their feet in support of families who are battling childhood cancer.
- Two students earned high honors at the Pennsylvania Federation of Music Clubs Festivals Piano Competition. Leona Chen – First Place in respective level & First Place in overall competition among all levels. Eva Twedt – First Place in respective level & Second Place in overall competition among all levels.
- Noah Stein was selected to compete for Team Pennsylvania at the U16 National Duals. He wrestled in the 88-pound weight class in the national tournament in Spokane, Washington and is one of only two Pennsylvania wrestlers selected to compete in his weight-class. In total, Team Pennsylvania is comprised of 27 wrestlers from 17 weight classes.

- Lucas Gillespie placed second in the SkillsUSA Pennsylvania Championship in the Building Construction Category. Approximately 1400 students from throughout Pennsylvania participated in the 52nd SkillsUSA Pennsylvania Leadership Conference.
- Two teams of students qualified to advance to the National Future Business Leaders of America competition in San Antonio, Texas. The Emerging Business Issues Team finished third in the Pennsylvania Competition. The Business Ethics Team placed fourth. The top four in each category at the state-level competition qualified for nationals. Teams included: Emerging Business Issues Team – Third Place: Mallika Matharu, Meghan Joon, Arushi Khaitan. Business Ethics Team – Fourth Place: Mathena Jencka, Anika Sinha, Olivia John
- Fort Couch Middle School Symphonic winds and jazz bands earned top honors at the Music in the Parks Festival at Hershey Park. In addition to both bands earning first place in the concert band and jazz ensemble categories, they also received the Hershey Park Esprit de Corps Award.
- Nicholas Atland earned fourth place honors in the annual Congressional Art Competition, sponsored by the Congressional Arts Caucus of the United States House of Representatives. Nicholas was recognized for his photograph, titled “Over the Mon.” His award-winning photo is displayed in Congressman Doyle’s Bethel Park office.
- Paarth Shankar placed 14th in Extemporaneous Speaking at the National Catholic Forensic League Grand National Tournament held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.
- Reese Benonis earned a college-sponsored Merit Scholarship and was selected to receive the National Merit University of Alabama Scholarship.
- The Upper St. Clair 12U baseball team finished 6-0 in pool play in the Cooperstown Dreams Park Tournament in Cooperstown, New York. The team was seeded 12th out of 104 teams. At the end of the tournament week, the team was inducted into the American Youth Baseball Hall of Fame.
- Six Upper St. Clair High School seniors were named Semifinalists in the 2020 National Merit Scholarship Competition. The following students scored in the top one percent of all juniors completing the PSAT in October 2018: Julia Brubach, Nisarg Kalra, Vivian Li, Daniel O’Brien, Ian Rankin, Braden Yates.
