Course Selection Process

- The <u>Program of Studies</u> is available on the <u>High School Counseling website</u> and includes all courses and their descriptions
- USCHS uses the FOCUS platform for scheduling (Student Portal)
 - Students/families can view course recommendations under Course Requests in Focus in year 2024-2025
- Course Selection begins February 12th
 - Grade 9: Counselors will facilitate course selection during Freshman Seminar
 - Grades 10-11: Counselors will visit English classrooms to facilitate course selection
 - Students will select courses in Student Portal for the upcoming school year

Schedule Change Policy

- All students are required to take 5 full credit classes per semester
 - Plus a Wellness credit (2 courses for 10th graders and 1 course for 11th graders)
- All students will be assigned a lunch
- Students wishing to add Resource Center to schedules should speak to their counselors
- No courses will be changed for the purpose of requesting a different teacher

Schedule Change Policy

- Once courses are selected, only class changes that meet the criteria defined in the Program of Studies and Student/Parent Handbook will be honored:
 - Curriculum Program Change
 - Employment
 - Scheduling Error
 - Previous Failure
 - Summer School Record
 - Urgent/Personal/Appointment Conflicts

Schedule Change Policy

- Students may add/drop classes during the first two weeks of the semester with no impact on the student's transcript (schedule must include the minimum permissible number of courses).
- Students who are approved to drop a course outside of this window will receive a designation of "W" on their transcript next to the student's earned grade at the departure of the course. This becomes a part of the student's permanent record.
- For level changes, the student's percentage of achievement will transfer to the new course.

Graduation from Upper St. Clair High School requires satisfactory completion of a cumulative minimum of 44.5 credits in grades 9, 10, 11, and 12 in order to participate in the graduation ceremony. The requirements by subject areas are listed below:
