What is different about the Primary Years Program?

- Inquiry Teaching Method Attempts to improve questioning techniques, curiosity, independent work habits, cooperation, control over material covered, and interest in classroom units of study.
- Learner Profile Supports students in developing international-mindedness and in taking action for positive change.
- International-mindedness Broadens the students' understanding of the world around them and helps them develop an appreciation for other points of view.

How and where is the USC-PYP being offered?

- The PYP is an international curriculum framework designed for children from the ages of 3 to 12 years.
- The USC Primary Years Program opened for students in Grades 1, 2, and 3 in September, 1998 at Streams Elementary School and expanded to include Grade 4 in September, 1999 and Kindergarten in 2013. A Certificate of Authorization was received from IBO in 2003. Program re-evaluation visits were conducted in 2008, 2015, and 2020.
- When appropriate, the classes work as a multi-age team to meet individual needs and to provide opportunities to learn with children of different ages. This enhances the sense of IB identity and family.
- Students from all three elementary schools can enroll in the PYP, with priority given to students residing in the Streams area.
- Transportation to the PYP magnet program at Streams is provided by the school district.
- If there are more applicants than available positions, a waiting list is maintained.
- Additionally, both the Middle Years Program and an internationally recognized Diploma Program for secondary school students are offered in the Upper St. Clair School District.
