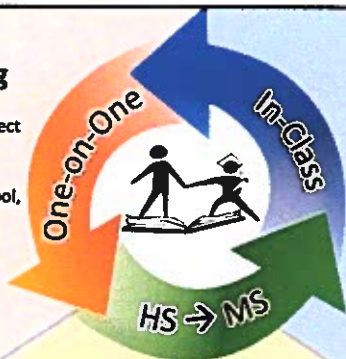


What is Peer Tutoring?

One-on-One High School Tutoring

- Tutor and student are matched according to subject area, level, and availability
- Students meet during free periods, lunch, before school, and after school
- Meet twice or three times per week



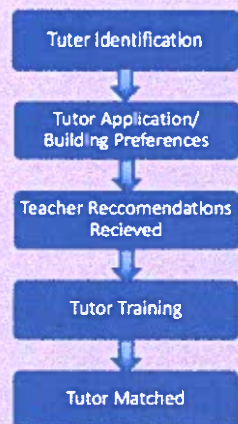
High School Classroom Support

- In-class helper
- Work with individual students or support in large-group activities
- Help absent students catch up
- Assist twice per week

Middle School End of Day Support

- Support in 5th – 6th grade and 7th-8th grade buildings
- 2 times per week
- Bussed after high school day ends
- Teacher-requested support
- Individual student support
- Class wide support
