

Office of Vocational Rehabilitation

- ~ Help high school kids transition from high school into work/employment/training.
- ~ Child must have a diagnosed disability to be eligible for services and must have an impediment to reach their employment goal.
- ~ We can provide financial assistance to kids in need based on family income; it can be any type of training program (college/business, trade, or tech school)
We pay up to \$4000 a year for 2/4 year colleges and \$4500 to business, trade, and tech schools; this is all based on family income and FAFSA grants.
- ~ We can provide job placement assistance either after high school or after college; we have job placement counselors on staff that conduct workshops on the basics of job placement (resume writing, interviewing skills, how to do a proper job search, etc).
- ~ Job coaching: an intensive type of job placement assistance where someone is assigned to a job coach and they help not only with finding a job but also supports on the job.
- ~ Neuropsych testing: colleges require certain documentation for a child to continue receiving learning supports in college and we can provide this testing during their senior year if they want it.
- ~ Vocational evaluation: an evaluation to determine skill levels and abilities; most of the time it is done after high school if a person is uncertain about their skills levels, abilities, and appropriate job fits for them.
- ~ Community Based Assessment: this is where a person can try out different jobs to see what would fit them best; this is usually a service for someone who isn't going to college and just straight to work and needs help determining what they should do employment wise.
